PROGRESS update

- Educational Puzzle:
 - Now can auto-generate puzzles
 - Added loading screen when loading images
 - Added pop up window to prompt user when the program is inactive for 3 minutes
 - Added sounds for the puzzle game
 - Improved random algorithm to scramble puzzle pieces
 - Improved resizing algorithm so that all images are loaded and resized appropriately
 - Buttons are positioned at the bottom corners

- Mini GPS system for the android application to detect its current location when inside the museum
- Access data from google spreadsheet so that people from the museum can modify the information of the android app with ease
